



Rehabilitation of the Sinoe County Administration Building

- Built in 1959
- Rehabilitation: April 2008 to January 2009
- Rehabilitation grant to the Ministry of Interior: USD\$160,000.00, including \$10,000 for office furniture

The Sinoe County Administration Building is located in Greenville, in the southeast of Liberia. This two-storey, 7,000 sq.ft, "T" shaped structure (originally sixteen rooms, now 34) serves as the center of local government administration in Sinoe County.

The building was constructed during the administration of Superintendent James E. Greene, who later became Vice President of Liberia. Original funding for the construction of the building was provided by the Government of Liberia during the administration of President William V. S. Tubman.

The major rehabilitation works include:

- complete construction of roof and ceiling,
- supply and installation of doors, frames and windows;
- electrical conduits and fixtures; repair of minor cracks and plastering of damaged walls;
- total rehabilitation of drainage, sewer, electrical and plumbing systems;
- supply and installation of burglar bars, painting of exterior and interior.

In addition to the above, USAID's Liberia Community Infrastructure Program (LCIP) added 18 additional offices (11 upstairs and 7 in the basement), and constructed two security booths, a water tower, a generator room and office furniture. USAID's Liberia Energy Assistance Program (LEAP) installed solar-powered exterior security lights.

The Sinoe Administration Building houses, among others, the officials of the Ministry of Internal Affairs (Superintendent's Office), Development Superintendent, County Inspector, Representatives of the Ministries of Commerce, Education, Planning, Labor, Education, Youth and Sport, Lands, Mines and Energy, as well as the General Services Agency (GSA), and the Circuit Court.
